



Shielding Tribal Communities: Tribal First and WASP Partner to Fight Wildfire Threats

Delivering rapid-response SPU trailers, expert crews, and complimentary NFPA assessments.

Tribal First has entered into an exclusive strategic partnership with WASP/Ember Defense to help clients strengthen structural survivability during wildfire events. This partnership is designed to compliment existing tribal and local fire authority efforts by providing additional resources that support wildfire preparedness and response.

Services include the strategic placement of Type 2 Structural Protection Unit trailers equipped with external fire protection tools, including sprinklers, hose lines, pumps, generators, temporary water storage, hand tools, and other critical equipment. These trailers will support Tribal First clients in California and the Pacific Northwest, with placement guided by historical wildfire data and current exposure levels. To account for changing wildfire conditions, trailer placement will remain flexible and may be adjusted based on real-time threat levels, current exposure, and trailer availability. In addition, trained SPU crews will be on call and available for deployment to help protect structures and support tribal and local fire authority response efforts.

WASP monitors North American wildfire activity 24-7. If there is a wildfire threat to a Tribal First client's business enterprise or government building, we will contact the threatened client(s) and arrange SPU trailer and crew deployment.

Proactive wildfire preparedness is critical to advancing structural survivability. This includes hardening structures and ensuring surrounding hazard zones are properly managed before a wildfire approaches. To support these efforts, Tribal First offers complimentary wildfire assessments for clients in areas with high wildfire exposure. These assessments are based on the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Firewise guidelines. As part of the process, Tribal First also works to engage with tribal and local fire authorities to explain available resources, encourage coordination, and support a collaborative response.

WASP is not intended to replace tribal or local fire professionals. The goal of this partnership is to complement existing fire protection efforts and help reduce the potential for wildfire-related property loss.
